



Committee about Bullying

Calls upon European member states to efficiently take all appropriate measures to prevent and protect children, and especially students, from any form of violence by promptly responding to such acts and by providing appropriate psychological support to children affected by and involved in bullying;

Urges European citizens to participate in European workshops and open talks regarding bullying;

Further invites European member states to develop parenting and other skill programs for parents, legal guardians and family members that help the assurance of a nurturing and supporting family environment;

Encourages European campaigns addressed to students against any form of bullying;

Also encourages European schools, that have not yet done so, to adopt appropriate measures concerning counseling programs addressed to bullying victims;

Recommends European schools to adopt counseling programs aiming to repair harm, restore relationships and change aggressive behavior between all parties involved in bullying incidents;

Invites the European Union to adopt stricter policies on the matter discussed.
