BULLYING AND CYBERBULLYING



- Bullying: it is when an individual or a group of peolple, repeatedly and intentionally, carry out aggressive acts which cause hurt or harm to another person or group of people who cannot easily defend themselves.
- Cyberbullying: it is similar to bullying, but it involves the use of new communication technologies.



- Behaviour: hostile, aggressive
- Intention: awareness of harming others



Bullying

 Face-to-face bullying implies a higher physical or psychological strenght of the bully (or group of bullies)

 Digital bullying implies rude or nasty comments online, rumors spread on social media, threatening or aggressive comments in chat rooms or video chats.

- 29% of teens insult friends online
- 41% of teens have posted unflattering pictures of friends intentionally
